

Basic Joinery II - Advanced

Instructors: Frank Tucker, Daryl Coulthart & Charlie Lagergren

Prerequisite: Must have completed Basic Joinery I (or permission of the instructor)

Enrollment: Limited to a maximum of four, with a minimum of two

Schedule: Classes are offered once a month on Monday or Tuesday and meet for 3+ hours. Class starts at 3:00 PM in the Woodshop Library and finish in the Machine Room (verify dates and times using on-line wood club monthly calendar).

Student Materials to Buy & Prepare Prior to Class: None - instructor will provide each student with the needed one piece of wood 1/2" thick x 3" wide x 36" long.

Description: This is the second level of basic woodworking joinery classes. We will explore edge joints, rabbets, dado, groove, and rabbit-and-dado joints. We will discuss when to use these joints, how to ensure they are strong, and why they are strong. The student must be proficient in the joints discussed in Joinery Basics I to be successful in this class. At the completion of this class, the student will have joinery skills to make most small decorative and utility boxes.

Fee: \$15 - this includes the instructor pre-purchase and preparation of material

Tools: Will be provided, however, it is recommended that the student bring their own 5mm mechanical pencil or [marking knife](#) to class.
